Central Sanskrit University formerly known as Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan was established on 16th October 1970 with the recommendation of Central Sanskrit Board as an autonomous organization registered under the Societies Registration Act, 160 (Act XXI of 1860) for the development and promotion of Sanskrit all over the country and abroad. It was fully funded by Government of India and functioned as an apex body for propagation and development of Sanskrit and assisted the Ministry of Human Resource Development in formulating and implementing various plans and schemes for the development of Sanskrit Studies.

In 2002, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan itself, along with its constituent campuses was declared as a Deemed University on the recommendation of University Grant Commission by the MHRD Department of Higher & Secondary Education, New Delhi vide their notification no: 9-282000-U-3 dated 7th May, 2002.

Later on March 2020 Parliament of India passed the Central Sanskrit Universities Act 2020 and now its known as Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi. It has the unique distinction of being the largest and the only multi-campus language university in the world. It also has the privilege of acting as the nodal agency for the implementation of Sanskrit related policies & schemes of the Government of India. The University has been accredited with the prestigious “A++ Grade” by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC).

Vedavyas Campus of Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi is situated in the state of Himachal Pradesh. It was established in 16th September 1997 in village Garli. Guidelines for Submission of Paper

Original contributions/research papers based on the theme and sub-theme of the conference are invited in English/Hindi/Sanskrit. The paper strictly adheres to the following guidelines:-

For Papers in English Language

1. The paper should contain the author's name, designation, organisation, address, telephone and E-mail address.
2. Papers should be typed in 8.5"x11" page size, 1.25" margins, MS-Word, Times New Roman, 14-point fonts for the title, heading and sub heading. 12 point fonts for text.
3. Papers should not normally exceed 5,000 words or 16 double-spaced pages, besides tables, diagrams, etc. Also, each paper should contain an abstract, up to ten keywords, body of the paper, conclusion and references.
4. The abstract should state in about 150 words the sum and substance of the paper. The conclusion should include the recommendations made in the paper.
5. APA reference style should be used for in-text and endnote references.
6. Paper must accompany a declaration that it is the original contribution of the author(s) and not published earlier or submitted elsewhere for publication.
7. The editorial committee will review the submitted paper, and necessary modifications can also be made if deemed required by the committee.
8. Please submit a similarity check certificate along with the research paper. Only those papers which are plagiarism-free as per the guidelines of the UGC and are presented in the Conference will be incorporated into the Conference Proceeding.
9. A Reputed publisher will publish the proceedings with an ISBN.

For Papers in Hindi and Sanskrit Language

The participants who want to submit their papers in Hindi/Sanskrit language must use Unicode-compliant font only for preparing their papers. Please follow the rest of the guidelines as mentioned above.
